# **Alumni Workshop**

The Alumni Workshop on the 7th of February was a great success! Various issues our Alumni face were discussed.

One of the main issues discussed was how difficult it is to find the right information with regards to future steps in education and guidance in life in general. If your parents are not able to advise you (some parents are illiterates and some alumni live with their extended family) there are not a lot of other structures in place to help you along.

We have therefore taken on the task of providing (digital/phone) counseling on education/professional level as well as on a personal level through a partner organization called TUCEE. Our Alumni will be provided a special SIM card that will allow them access to personal counseling, but also as a group. Group sessions will be set up where various topics will be discussed.

At the end of the Alumni Workshop Frank & Qweku were appointed Alumni Coordinators. They have been very active in helping us track Alumni and building lines of communication.



#### **Solar Light for Homework**

With the escalating electricity situation in Ghana many children do not have access to light to do their homework or read. This summer we launched a program to obtain 200 WakaWaka solar lights to distribute to the children at the Centre (12-15 years) as their time at school is crucial. They are either transitioning from primary to secondary school or from Junior High School to Senior High School and have study for exams to do so. We have been able to obtain 150 WakaWaka Solar lights so far. We would like to thank everyone who helped us achieve this by buying a WakaWaka Power or donating a Solar light.

## "I Want To Be" Program


On the 11th of April we started the *I Want to Be Program* at the Takoradi Educational Centre. A Program designed to open the minds of children to career opportunities and to show them what's available in the community, to help them better understand their own talents and interests and to help develop important skills including computer skills, team work and self-evaluation. During the program, the children get together at the To Be centre in Takoradi to undertake various activities, ranging from discovering personal talents to visiting companies to finding out what careers interest them. Outside of the classroom sessions, kids complete assignments and ask input from family and friends.

12 children in the age group of 12 -15 years participated. The program is set to run over a period of 3 months. We have a great team in place to run the program. From our partner organizations Mr. Kofi Essien (OLE) Mrs. Cecilia Tutu-Danqua and Ms. Doris Agra (TUCEE) from the Ministry of Education Mrs Stella Arthur, Mr. Harry Richmond and Mrs Naomi Insaidoo. # **Cape Coast Centre**


Recently a large meeting was organized at the Centre in Cape Coast that was attended by many of the head masters and mistresses of the mostly public schools in the vicinity of the Centre.
